PROSTATE SPECIFIC ANTIGEN (PSA) SCREENING

A Prostate Specific Antigen (PSA) screening is a blood test available to men to screen for the possibility of prostate cancer. It alone is not conclusive evidence of whether prostate cancer does or does not exist. A digital examination by a physician/nurse practitioner may also be used to assist in the screening process. Additional information regarding prostate cancer and associated screenings may be available through your care provider.

1. The PSA usually is most useful in screening men 45 years of age and older or those determined by their care provider to be at risk. Living Well Health Fair PSA screenings are open to males who are at least 18 years of age.
2. Please remember that to have blood drawn for the PSA, HbA1c and/or the Blood Chemistry Analysis, **you must provide the name and address of your physician/nurse practitioner.** This must be done at the time of registration, whether it is at a pre-registration site or at the hospital on the day of the health fair. **A copy of your screening results will be sent to both you and your physician or nurse practitioner for follow-up.**
3. No preparation (such as fasting, etc.) is necessary on the part of the participant.
4. Participants may take part in the PSA with or without the other blood screenings.
5. The cost of the PSA screening is \$10. Payment is required on the day of the fair. Cash, major credit and debit cards, and personal checks will be accepted. Checks should be made payable to **Highpoint Health Living Well Health Fair.**
6. You are strongly encouraged to contact your urologist or personal physician/nurse practitioner within several days after receiving your PSA results.

Living Well Health Fair screenings should be used as supplemental health information by the participant. They do not represent a diagnosis. Screenings do not replace and should not be considered a substitute for an examination by a physician/nurse practitioner.
